From Pastor Lloyd....

Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or tremble at them, for the Lord your God is the one who goes with you; He will never fail you nor forsake you. (Deuteronomy 31:6)

Dear folks at Maranatha,

Have any of you at some point in life found yourself in a spot you never planned to be in and felt ill prepared for? As we all get older, at times we encounter increasingly difficult circumstances. Life has its challenges related to our own health and that of those we love. There are also sometimes relationship challenges we don't know how to fix, and significant financial expenses we didn't anticipate. It takes courage to face these challenges head on rather than trying to run from them.

My recent travels to the eastern United States, including stops at some locations significant to the American Civil War, have me thinking about the serious challenges that people in the United States faced in that era. I think of our US President during that war, Abraham Lincoln, who encountered deaths of his own sons, and major depression of his wife, as well as the tremendous challenge of leading our nation through that dark time of our history. Those circumstances at times drove Lincoln to his knees in prayer in the middle of the night.

I think of General Robert E Lee, a highly respected Christian man, who was asked to serve as a general in the Union Army, but could not get himself to fight against family in the South. During the war he and his family left their home in Arlington, VA never to return to it. He became the leading general in the Confederate Army, and had many heavy decisions to make affecting thousands of troops. He courageously made those decisions and entrusted the results to God.

The movie "Gettysburg" depicts key characters in the Battle of Gettysburg, and impressed on me the scene in which Union soldiers are running out of ammunition as they try to hold off the advancing Confederate army. They are stationed on top of a hill known now as "the Little Round Top." Waves of Rebel soldiers are advancing up the hill and General Joshua Chamberlain makes the hard decision to not retreat, but instead lead a bayonet charge down the hill. It took great courage to lead in a time like that. He found himself in a position he could not possibly have planned for, assessed the situation, made the best decision he could and plowed ahead with his men.

At times in all of our lives I believe we will find ourselves facing tough decisions we would rather run from. In these times, as Christians, we may be forced to take stock of the situation as best we can, pray for wisdom and then make a decision. May we be encouraged by the above words of Moses to Joshua and the people of Israel, as they faced going into the Promised Land without Moses. May we move forward with courage because we know that God goes through our lives with us, and He will not fail or forsake us!


USE YOUR BUG SPRAY

One of the great misconceptions about worship is that it's something that only takes place when a group of people gather for a few minutes or so to sing together. While corporate worship is an important part of the Christian life, the kind of worship God calls us and our children to is a 24/7 endeavor that never ends.

In Romans 6:13 the Apostle Paul reminds us that we are to "use your whole body as an instrument to do what is right for the glory of God." Besides teaching this to our kids through our words and example, we must pray diligently for God's Spirit to move our kids to give their bodies over to God through worship.

In her book *Praying Through The Bible For Your Kids*, Nancy Guthrie offers a prayer we can not only pray for our kids, but one we should adapt to pray for ourselves. Take some time to write this prayer, laminate it, and keep it handy so that you can silently pray it each day as they head off to school.

Lord, from head to toe, inside and out, from beginning to end may no part of _____'s body become an instrument of evil to serve sin. Instead, may _____'s whole body be an instrument to do what is right for your glory!

Don't let ____'s feet take him to places where darkness will envelop him and seduce him. Instead, let his feet take him to places where he can push back the darkness and radiate your light.

Don't let _____'s appetite for sex or food or drink make him a slave to them. Instead, sanctify his appetites for sex and food and drink so that all of them cause him

to look to you for the sanctification he

craves.

Don't let ____'s heart go after passions that will take the place that should be reserved for you alone. Instead, break ____'s heart with the things that break your heart. Capture ____'s heart with a passion for your gospel and your glory.

Don't let _____'s mouth be used to speak what is false or filthy or futile. Instead, fill ____'s mouth with words of truth, words of purity, words of meaning and purpose. May _____'s mouth be full of blessing, encouragement, and peace.

Don't let ____'s hands grasp the things of this world too tightly. Instead, give him hands that are willing to work and hands that touch others in great compassion.

Don't let ____'s eyes seek out what is corrupting or contaminating. Give ____ a love for what is beautiful and pure.

Don't let _____'s ears tune in to voices that doubt or mock the things of God. Instead, give him ears that are open to your Word and your ways.

Don't let ____'s intellect be captured by the thought patterns of this world. Instead, fill his mind with the depths of your knowledge and wisdom.

There is one bit of information coming out of the 2018 report that I want to pass on to you as it can serve as encouragement for those parents whose pre-adolescent children are begging them for phones. Perhaps you've had one of your younger children beg for a smartphone. And when they've begged, they've informed you that they're the only kids among all their friends who doesn't have their own phone. The reality is that among kids ages eleven and younger, just over ten percent have their own smartphone.

It seems that the great majority of parents aren't giving in because they see how the potential dangers outweigh the benefits. Parents, be prudent on this matter in ways that promote your child's flourishing.


